WHEREAS, the crime of domestic violence violates an individual's privacy, dignity,

security and basic humanity; and

WHEREAS, the problem of domestic violence cuts across all socio-economic, racial,

sexual orientation, gender and geographic status; and

WHEREAS, 6,657 victims of domestic violence sought services from the member

programs of the Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence

last year; and

WHEREAS, on June 30, 2009 there were 1,240 persons under supervision of the

Department of Corrections for domestic violence-related offenses; and

WHEREAS, in 2009 there were 345 women, 182 children and 16 men who were

housed in shelters or safe-homes as part of member programs of the Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence; and

WHEREAS, domestic and sexual violence towards women, children and men are

inconsistent with the traditional values of Vermonters.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, James H. Douglas, Governor, do hereby proclaim October, 2010 as
