INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE September 21, 2003

- **WHEREAS,** the issue of peace embraces the deepest hopes of all peoples and remains humanity's guiding inspiration; and
- WHEREAS, the United Nations asked that the International Day of Peace be observed as a day of global cease-fire and non-violence, and invited all nations and people to honor a cessation of hostilities for the duration of the Day; and
